

ICLO-NLS 2018-19 PROGRAMME SUMMARY

• (1) ICLO-NLS OPEN EVENT

The opening of the Calendar year of ICLO-NLS activities and presentation of its Programme for 2018/19 will feature an event entitled *Aggressivity in the Mirror- Acts of Violence in Childhood and Adolescence* which launches the axis of work for ICLO-NLS. This theme will be interrogated by psychoanalyst and documentary film maker **Iván Ruiz** (ELP) from the perspective of his work with young subjects. A panel discussion with Ivan Ruiz and invited participants working within various fields and modalities in Ireland will allow for a further interrogation of this theme within a local context. This event should be of interest not only to psychoanalysts but also to counsellors, psychotherapists, psychiatrists, social workers, students and anyone with an interest in and or working with young people.

• (2) ICLO-NLS ANNUAL CLINICAL AND THEORETICAL SEMINAR

The axis for the ICLO-NLS Annual Seminar will be "Violence Today" which will constitute the frame for our work this year.

Guest speakers for 2018/19 are: Anne Beraud (Canada, NLS) – Oscar Ventura (Spain, ELP).

The first part of the day consists of a conference/seminar on a specific topic delivered by the guest speaker and linked to clinical practice.

The second part of the day includes the participation of one or more presenters in a dialogue with the visiting analyst about a published case-study, a public case or other material relative to the theme of the theoretical presentation.

A clinical conversation closed for members takes place in the afternoon.

• (3) ICLO-NLS SEMINAR OF THE SCHOOL

The Seminar of the School is an internal Seminar for ICLO-NLS members, whereby the dimension of Lacan's School is made present through the reading and discussion of a) the foundational texts referring to the concept of the School, the Cartel and the Pass; b) testimonies of the pass by Analysts of the School. The questions of the formation of the analyst, the passage from analysand to analyst, the bond of the analyst to the School as subject and the question of how the singularity of the subject member of the School can be maintained within a multitude that a School is made up of, are some of the topics to be elaborated in this space.

• (4) ICLO-NLS TEACHING SEMINAR

The ICLO-NLS Teaching Seminar entitled **Introductory Clinical Seminar to Lacanian Psychoanalysis** continues this year. The first three meetings held in (2017/2018) explored the beginning of analytic treatment following Jacques Alain Miller's Introduction to the Psychoanalytic Method and his concepts of "clinical evaluation" "subjective localization" and "introduction to the unconscious".

The **second module** 2018/2019 will be dedicated to "**The Course of an Analysis**", (principles of the direction of the treatment; politic-strategy-tactic; construction of the fantasy).

The third module (2019/2020) will be dedicated to the "(The) End(ing) of (an) Analysis" (traversing the fundamental fantasy; subjective destitution; symptom/sinthome; the drive and the Other at the end of analysis).

• (5) ICLO-NLS SPACE FORMATION OF THE ANALYST AND ITS SCHOOL

Evening events with analysts who engage in transmitting the knotting of the political dimension of psychoanalysis (namely, the end of analysis and the grouping of analysts) with its clinical and theoretical dimensions through the experience of the School.

This space continues the work done for the last four years by ICLO-NLS members through the reading and discussion of foundational texts (on the School, the Cartel and the Pass) and the studying of testimonies of the pass by Analysts of the School.

The questions of the formation of the analyst, the passage from analysand to analyst, the bond of the analyst to the School as subject, as well as the 'neurotic fundament of the desire of the analyst' -for each one-, will be put to work.

• (6) ICLO-NLS SPECIAL INTEREST GROUP

The Special Interest Group (SIG), *Child and Adolescent Lacanian Psychoanalysis* begins its 6th year of work. It is essentially a working group and aims to develop and share the specificity of the Lacanian psychoanalytic clinic with children and young people. It is a closed group which continues to grow through the work of its participants, who are both engaged with and wish to investigate questions pertaining to their clinical work (from a variety of disciplines).

• (7) STUDY-DAY

The ICLO-NLS Study-Day, which marks an important aspect of the year's work in ICLO, is the space where the year's cartel work and other work carried out by members and participants of ICLO is shared in an event that combines clinical and theoretical presentations with the presence and contribution of the current President of the *NLS Bernard Seynhaeve*. In 2019 the topic of the Study-Day will be based on that of the next NLS Congress to be held in Tel Aviv in 2019. The theme is *Urgent!*

The Study-Day on the 6th April is followed by the ICLO-NLS members Annual General Meeting.

• (8) ICLO-NLS CARTEL WORK

Work in Cartels is one of the crucial pillars grounding a formation in psychoanalysis and it is, at the same time, a space for anyone interested in psychoanalytic thinking. Anyone with an interest in Lacanian Psychoanalysis can choose this way of accessing knowledge not without others. There are no requirements (i.e. memberships, qualifications, clinical practice) other than wanting to inscribe one's singular relationship to psychoanalysis within the framework of this device invented by Lacan, where one works to figure out and follow one's own trait in the reading of the texts.
